The Basic course is a lecture/laboratory experience with the objective of providing in depth exposure to common rear limb instability problems veterinary practitioners experience in daily practice. Topics such as cranial cruciate ligament injury, meniscal injury, pre-emptive pain management and rehabilitation discussed using a case based format for each topic. The conference is limited to 40 participants in the basic lecture/lab.

The Advance course is a lecture/laboratory experience that will discuss application of a NEW knotless anchor system. The new knotless Swivelock® system is for application to larger breeds of dogs over 50 Lbs. It is required to have completed a basic course prior to taking the advanced course. Basic courses offered prior to this would include Texas A&M 2009, any Joint Stabilization Course sponsored by Arthrex Vet Systems in 2008, 2009, or 2010. The conference is limited to 24 in the advanced lecture/lab.
